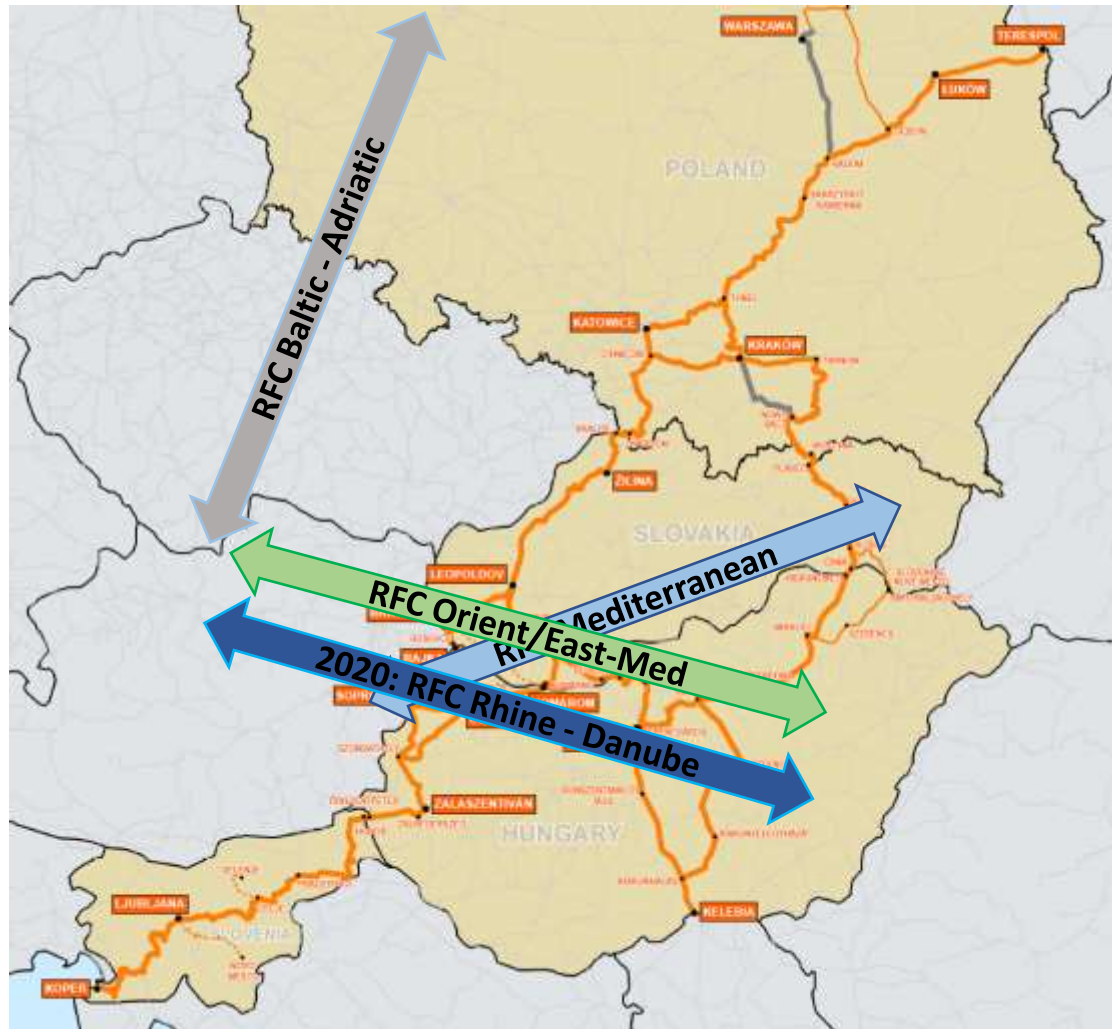

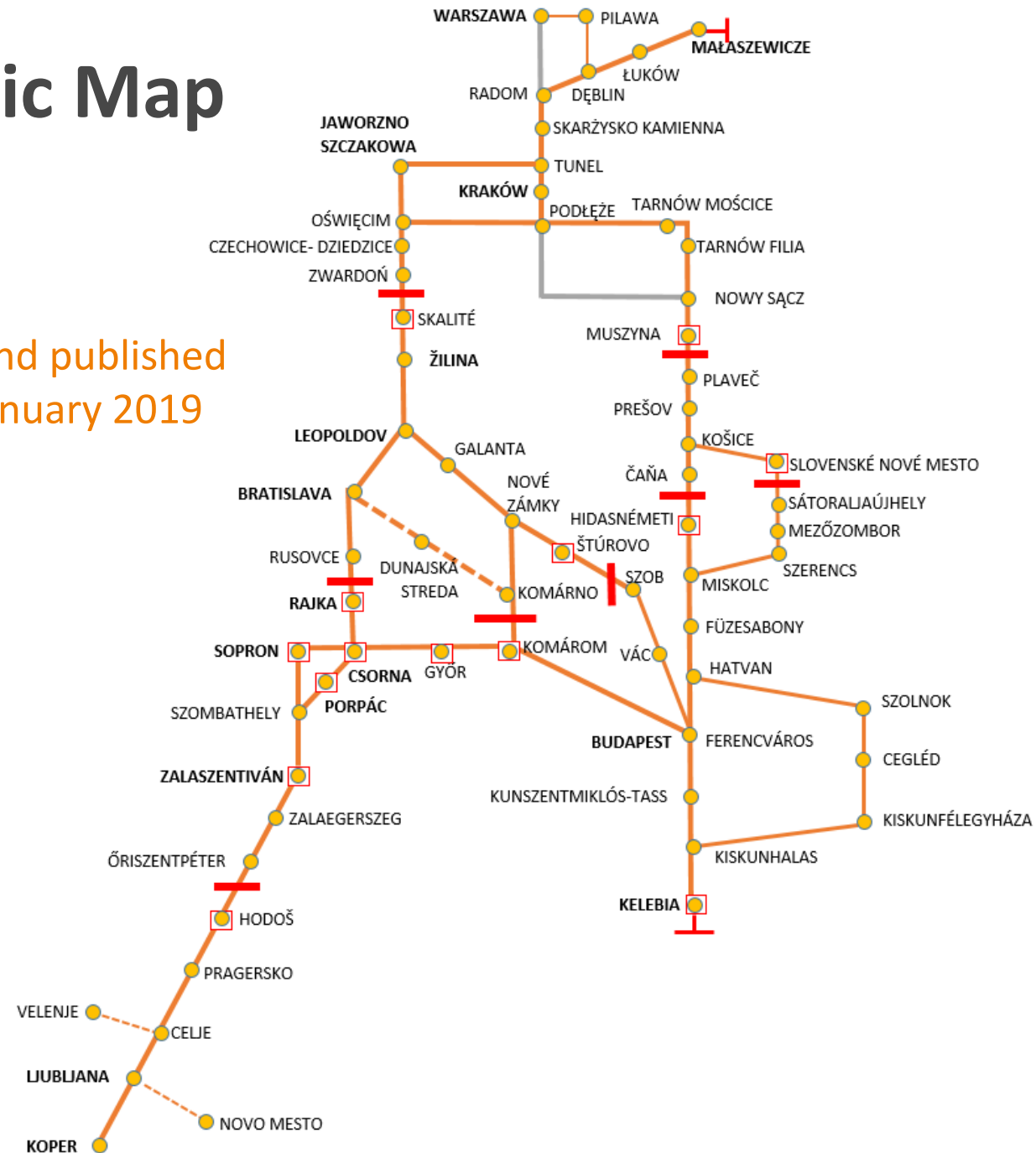
Governance structure
